#### Classes 2025

In 2025 there will be change to the composition of our classes. This is due to the sizes of the year groups as they move through the school. Any decision made on class composition is based entirely on ensuring the needs of all our students are being met and that they have the best conditions possible to thrive. Much thought and consideration has been put into this. No solution is ever perfect when we have uneven year group sizes but we do our best to ensure we choose the best solution possible.

In 2025 the classes are: NE/Year One - one class Year Two - one class Year Three and Four - two classes Year Four and Five - two classes Year Six - one class Year Seven and Eight - two classes Our akonga will find out their new class and their teacher on the last day of school. In the morning they will visit

#### **Cohort Entry**

From 2025 onwards Ngunguru School will be implementing Cohort Entry for our five year olds. Cohort entry is where children start school for the first time in groups on set dates, rather than on or after their fifth birthday. A recent Education Review Office found that cohort entry had a wide range of benefits for children, whānau, and schools, Schools found it contributed learning, successful learner wellbeing, quality teaching, supported their and

administration processes. Cohort entry also helped with positive ECE-to-school transitions for new entrants. We believe it will have numerous benefits for our kura. The set dates for cohort entry in 2025 are as follows

#### 2025 start dates:

Term 1 – 7 February or 10 March.

- Term 2 28 April or 26 May.
- Term 3 14 July or 18 August.
- Term 4 6 October or 10 November.

Children can start on one of 8 set dates throughout the year. Once your child turns 5 you can choose any of the dates below. They can't start before they turn 5 but must start by the time they turn 6. If you have any questions on cohort entry please do not hesitate to contact Whaea Anna, Matt Burns or myself.

#### Reports

End of Year reports are in their final stages. They will report on your child's progress in Reading, Writing and Mathematics as well as other other curriculum areas. In this report, these areas will be The Arts and Technology as these were the basis of our inquiry learning in terms 3 three and four. Reports will be available to whanau on the last day of school this term.

#### **BYOD**

As you know Ngunguru School is a bring your own device school (BYOD). Over the next few months deals from tech companies are often advertised for Chromebooks. Chromebooks are our preferred BYOD device. They can make a good Christmas gift. Some tech brands also offer payment plans or options to purchase refurbished Chromebooks which are considerably cheaper and work just as well. We do not have enough school devices for all students to have access to a device so do recommend the purchase of a Chromebook if possible. Please see either myself, Whaea Tess or Mr Burke if you would like more information on this.

#### **Use the pedestrian Crossing**

On another safety note, please make sure you are using the crossing morning and afternoon when you drop off and pick up your children. We all need to role model safe road crossing practices.

Please do not ask your child to cross the road to a vehicle in front of the school without using the crossing, this way everyone stays safe.

#### **BOT Spot**

Last night we held our final BOT meeting for the year. Looking back over the year, we were really pleased with



what we have achieved and very excited for next year. We accepted the resignation of our presiding member Amber Fayerberg. Amber has been an exceptional school trustee. 
